

## Dr. Achim Wennmann

Dr. Achim Wennmann is Researcher at the Centre on Conflict, Development and Peace-building (CCDP) of the Graduate Institute of International and Development Studies in Geneva, and Executive Coordinator of the Geneva Peacebuilding Plaform, an inter-agency network that connects the critical mass of peacebuilding actors, resources, and expertise in Geneva and worldwide.

Dr. Wennmann's active research interests involve the political economy of conflict, conflict economies, state fragility, peace processes, war-to-peace transitions, and the dynamics of armed conflict and violence. He has country expertise on Armenia, Azerbaijan, and Georgia, and worked extensively on the peace processes of Angola, Georgia, Kosovo, Nepal, and Sudan. He is author of *The Political Economy of Peacemaking* (London: Routledge, 2011), co-editor (with Mats Berdal) of *Ending Wars, Consolidating Peace: Economic Perspectives* (London IISS and Routledge, 2010); and co-editor (with Keith Krause and Robert Muggah) of the *Global Burden of Armed Violence* report for the Geneva Declaration on Armed Violence and Development at the Small Arms Survey in Geneva (2008). Dr. Wennmann also acted as a consultant for the OECD-INCAF work stream on international assistance to peace processes.
