Jeremy Brickhill served in Zimbabwe's liberation war as an officer in the military wing of Joshua Nkomo's Zimbabwe African People's Union (ZAPU) and was involved in the demobilization process in Zimbabwe after independence. Thereafter he has worked as an advisor, programme manager and trainer in post-conflict processes in Africa and elsewhere focusing on ceasefire and security arrangements.

He led the Zimbabwe Advisory Team which supported Somaliland's successful heavy weapon disarmament exercise in 1992-4, supported IGAD's Special Envoy during the negotiation of the Sudanese Comprehensive Peace Agreement and was posted as an advisor to the African Union Mediation Team during the Abuja Peace Talks on Darfur. He has worked for the United Nations as a program manager and advisor in several conflict countries, and as Senior Advisor for Security Sector Planning for the European Commission in Somalia (2007-8).

He has participated in many mediation and peace-building processes and is an active member of the African Security Sector Network (ASSN).

He is currently the Executive Director of the Zimbabwe Peace and Security Programme which aims to contribute, through the provision of impartial and professional technical assistance, to effective and sustainable modernisation and transformation of the security sector in Zimbabwe in order to enhance the democratic governance, security and national sovereignty of the people of Zimbabwe.
