

Dr. Joyce Neu

Dr. Joyce Neu is Founder and Senior Associate of Facilitating Peace, a consulting network focused on conflict analysis and assessment, peace processes including gendered peacemaking, and peer coaching. Neu's previous positions include Team Leader of the first United Nations' Standby Team of Mediation Experts and founding Executive Director of the Joan B. Kroc Institute for Peace & Justice at the University of San Diego where she co-created the Women PeaceMakers Program and a graduate program in Peace and Justice Studies.

Prior to these positions, Neu was the Senior Associate Director of the Conflict Resolution Program at The Carter Center where she advised former President Jimmy Carter on conflicts in more than two dozen countries and led several mediation efforts. For the past 20 years, Dr. Neu has also helped prepare women from zones of conflict to participate in peace processes.

Dr. Neu has a Ph.D. in sociolinguistics from the University of Southern California and has taught at the University of Southern California, Penn State University, Adam Mickiewicz University (Poznan, Poland), Emory University, and the University of San Diego. She has published on conflict resolution, negotiations, sociolinguistics, and international war crimes tribunals. Dr. Neu was a senior Fulbright scholar in Poland and a Peace Corps volunteer in Senegal. In her spare time, she volunteers as a "citizen scientist" for the American Cetacean Society's annual census of the gray whale migration.
